Dear Mr. Joyal,

In a letter sent to you on August 7, the Bureau of Motor Vehicles asked you to send, within 10 business days, the motorcycle plate and registration for your 2007, ZAP issued to you on May 23, 2008. As of today, the Bureau has not received them.

The Secretary of State has determined that this type of vehicle should not be permitted on public streets and highways. The Secretary must make these types of determinations when it is in the best interest of highway safety. Motor Vehicle Statutes, Title 29-A, Section 401(4) was adopted to ensure that the safety of all drivers is maintained to the highest possible degree.

Effective August 25, 2008, the registration certificate, number plate 157EP(MC), your right to register the 2007 ZAP will be suspended from any further use on the highways of the State.

We ask you once again to send or deliver the plate and registration to the address listed below, attention Registration Section. Your registration will then be listed as inactive instead of suspended.

For your reference, the Bureau's action is being taken under the provisions of Title 29-A, Section 2458(1).

In order to give you the opportunity to respond to this letter, you may request a hearing to discuss the Bureau's decision. Hearings are held according to laws set forth in Title 29-A, Title 5, and Chapter 2 rules of the Secretary of State.

You may contact me directly to request a hearing or to answer any questions you might have.
